Position statement: 'Type 2 diabetes in children and young people'

The number of children and young people with type 2 diabetes is in the UK is rising. The increase is a particularly concerning aspect of the diabetes epidemic because of the more aggressive form of the condition in young people compared to older adults.

Diabetes UK has produced this <u>position statement</u> that makes recommendations of the care children and young people with type 2 diabetes should receive and the steps that need to be taken to prevent more developing the condition.

Diabetes Care Accreditation Programme (DCAP)

Diabetes inpatient care varies considerably across hospitals, regions and nations. The Royal College of Physicians (RCP) Accreditation Unit and Diabetes UK set up the Diabetes Care Accreditation programme (DCAP) to provide assurance that national standards for diabetes care in hospital are being met equally across hospitals in the UK.

We're currently looking to recruit a Scottish representative to join our steering group. The group are responsible for reviewing the standards and process and providing expert advice and guidance to support the accreditation programme. DCAP works closely with JBDS, Diabetes UK and ABCD to ensure that standards are up to date and appropriate. We would value your input to the programme.

What's expected:

There will likely be 2 remote meetings per year, each around 2 hours.



- There will be an expectation to review and input into materials (e.g. standards document) by email and provide us with feedback and thoughts about anything related to accreditation.
- Individuals will be representing groups so the aim would be for each individual to gather views from colleagues that they are representing.
- Support us as ambassadors and champions of DCAP.
- Keep us updated about any issues you are aware of which may be useful for us to consider with the programme.
